Retrospect 14th Annual Conference, 6-8 July 2007, Prague

Thanks to Maggie Snowling (program chair) and Marketa Caravolas (local organizer), who both did a marvellous job, the annual conference was a great success again. Many interesting interactive paper sessions, and symposia were on the program, and the location and surroundings were much appreciated. The plenary session was used by Pieter Reitsma to give his Presidential Address. There had been 340 submissions, and after review by the program committee 296 presentations were accepted. A total of 312 participants registered for the conference. This year the Society began to use a convenient web-based submission system skilfully made by our webmaster Matt Fields.

Scientific Studies of Reading

The official journal of our Society is in very good shape. The number and quality of submissions is growing and the most recent impact factor for the journal was given as 2.38. The previous publisher Erlbaum has been taken over by Taylor and Francis. The editor of our journal, Charles Hulme, successfully negotiated a new contract for the journal. A web-based manuscript submission system will be adopted soon, and likely some increase in number of pages after 2008 (with an associated increase in subscription costs, and thus in Society dues).

Finances

The Society is financially well in balance and the dues structure will remain the same for the next year. This membership due includes a significant reduction on the conference fee, and a personal subscription to the journal SSR.

Travel awards

The board decided to establish 2 travel awards for presenters from emerging or developing economies (using World Bank Countries Classifications). The awards will be announced with the Call for Proposals, and information and applications for the awards will be provided on our website. Decisions will be made by the program committee.
