GETTING AROUND

This is the website of Copenhagen's tourist information.

Both Google and Apple maps are pretty good at suggesting routes, including how to get somewhere by public transport. Follow the above link for information on how to buy tickets.

If you go by bicycle, remember to raise your arm as a signal to those behind you if you need to stop suddenly. And be advised that biking is a means of transportation for a lot of people. It can get a bit spirited in rush hours, and at those times may be more fun to watch than to participate in.

If you prefer walking, please note that the special biking lanes are for bicycles – not pedestrians.

Cars are NOT very likely to stop for pedestrians at zebra crossing, unless you signal beyond a doubt that you intend to cross the road. Otherwise, Danes tend to be quite friendly.

FINDING ACCOMMODATION

SSSR has reserved a block of rooms at a discount rate at the conference hotel, Scandic Falkoner, and also at the sister hotel Scandic Kødbyen (2.4 km from Scandic Falkoner).

This one is part of the Scandic hotel chain, but SSSR does not have a block of rooms at a discount rate as we do at Scandic Falkoner (the conference hotel) and Scandic Kødbyen. However, the location of Scandic Nørreport is good and there is a nice view from the cafe on top. The metro is right outside and only two stops from Frederiksberg station (which is about 3 minutes walking distance from the conference venue).
